## Medical/Crisis Social Workers:

Medical social workers play an essential role in many of the non-medical aspects of patient care. Medical social workers combine a strong understanding of clinical social work practices and modalities (such as psychosocial assessments, crisis interventions and psychotherapy) with knowledge of medical environments and protocols. They must complete 6-8 years of combined undergraduate and graduate school, plus two or more years of internship experience. They provide patient care by conducting psychosocial assessments to identify mental or emotional distress, counseling those in crisis or experiencing distress, and connecting patients and their families with necessary resources.
